2019-2020 Schlagle Dress Code

- Shirts, blouses, and other tops must meet the waistband of pants, skirts, shorts, or other bottom attire. Tube tops, halter tops, low cut top, strapless, spaghetti straps, off the shoulder and clothing that bares the midriff are prohibited.
- The length of dresses, skirts, and shorts are to be closer to the knee.
- Clothes should conceal undergarments at all times. Clothing that is transparent or see-through, and/or that reveals any private part of the body is prohibited.
- Leggings must be worn with a skirt, pants, long jacket, long sweater, or long shirt to cover the rear end.
- Hoodies, head wraps, do rags and sunglasses may not be worn inside the building during school hours. Hair picks may not be worn in the hair during school hours.
- Street shoes must be worn at all times. House shoes, house slippers, and pajamas are not allowed.
- Clothing that may cause damage to persons or property, such as cleats and other garments are prohibited.
- Clothing or jewelry that displays obscene, vulgar, or pornographic words or images and clothing that advertises or promotes drugs, alcohol, weapons, or tobacco products and/or illegal acts or violence is prohibited.
- ID badges are to be visibly worn during the school day.
- Clothing normally worn when participating in a school-sponsored extracurricular sports activity may be worn to school when approved by the sponsor or coach.

JCDB Dress Code

Neatness, decency and good taste are guidelines of the district dress code. Students must dress in a manner that is not obscene; offensive; or substantially or materially disruptive to the learning environment. Apparel that is sexually suggestive; promotes violence, illegal activities, drugs, alcohol, and/or tobacco; or is determined to be gang related is prohibited. Clothing likely to cause a disruption of the educational process or create a health or safety problem is prohibited.

Student apparel and grooming must also meet requirements of any courses which are part of the approved curriculum in which they are enrolled.
